


cost all about?



Fifty days after the joy of the Easter resurrection, we celebrate Pentecost. The Church year is divided into seasons based on the holidays and events that we celebrate throughout the year. The season of Pentecost starts near the end of May and goes until Advent in December. Pentecost is probably one of the least well-known and understood seasons of the Church year, and also the longest. But, what is Pente-

#### Notes from the Finance Committee:

April revenues were slightly off for the month reversing the first guarter trend. Typically Easter falls in April and giving that week tends to be strong. This year Easter fell in March and as reported, we saw March revenues were higher than expected. On the other-hand, this year April then suffered a shortfall from budget. The total shortfall was approximately \$5,500.

Expenses for the month were about \$3,500 higher than budget. The biggest reason for the extra expenses was some additional expense in Building maintenance as well as cost over-runs in the Wednesday night services. The numbers for the Wednesday services were over-all very positive and those who attended really enjoyed service and the mid-week option. While the Wednesday services will be suspended over the summer they will no-doubt start again in September and management will work on tightening the expenses and still provide a quality experience. In total Holy Trinity is now approximately \$10,000 behind budget for the year thru April.

The Visioning expenses for 2016 remained in-line with budget. Given the slower summer period at all churches coupled with the costs of the Visioning, the approved shortterm financing will likely begin to be utilized within the coming months. The changes related to the Visioning Strategy are expected to pay for themselves within 3 years so leadership will steward over this financing accordingly. Please continue to consider the needs of the church and its mission when you review your personal giving.

We are glad you have chosen to be members at Holy Trinity and look forward to seeing you soon. We hope your summer starts great!

If expense is over \$10,000 Pastor Thompson will call a congrega tional meeting for approval. 2) East side of building is in need of tuck pointing. Cost unknown; Jed Becher and Jamie Bisek working on estimates.
- 3) Parking lot discussion about whether there is an eminent need to repair, replace or stripe. Question raised about the property behind State Bank which will trigger improvements to HTLC drainage and entrance change. Costs and development

unknown.

Strategic Plan: Fife questioned the coordination between stakeholders because seems to be much cross over; Pastor Thompson said there is talking going on between the teams.

Review Action & Decision Register: Fife reviewed and updated Action and Decision Register.

Pastor's Report: Call Committee—Congregation approved on 4/10; Pastor is making contact with Synod and the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) will be circulated to council soon. The call process could take up to a year as it is a "sellers" market. Council should support efforts of committee throughout process.

Strategic Plan—Three biggest areas to work on include: establishing a Communications Teams, a "Welcoming" Team, and HTLC's internal systems software with new website.

Program Size Church—The size of HTLC's congregational membership is evolving the church into a "program" size church rather than a "pastor" centered church. More about the programs and others in the church rather than a one-toone relationship with the Pastor.

On April 30<sup>th</sup> presentation on "Is Islam at War with the West?" and community is invited and June 5<sup>th</sup> is Celebration Sunday with brunch.

Treasurers Report: Trachte reported January and February giving was on budget. Sonshine revenues are down \$2,000. Expenses are in line. YTD behind about \$1,000. Cash is fine.

#### Borrow and Give

Expedition Norway is not just VBS—it's an EXPERIENCE. To help with the experience, we decorate and create welcoming spaces for the children. Beginning at the end of June, we will be asking for items to borrow and items to be donated. These items will include Christmas trees to borrow and snacks to donate. Franciscan International Award

We are pleased to announce that the 2016 recipient of the Franciscan International Award will be **Beacon Interfaith Housing Collaborative**, a collaborative organization of churches that seek to end homelessness through housing. The **Families Moving Forward** shelter program, and public advocacy includes The Hope House that Holy Trinity Lutheran Church and other churches in our area support.

Since 2003, Beacon has created or preserved almost 500 homes for 800 people, families, youth, and adults. By 2020, Beacon hopes to provide 1000 homes for people in need. Through the Families Moving Forward program, in which Franciscan Retreats and Spirituality Center participates with the Church of St. Michael Prior Lake, families experiencing homelessness are provided hospitality, emergency shelter, and a path to a home with support for stability. Beacon advocates for affordable housing in a variety of ways, especially in the legislative process.

Since 1959, The Franciscan International Award has honored men, women and organizations who symbolize the spirit and the apostolic zeal of St. Francis of Assisi. Previous recipients of the award include: **Dr. Billy Graham for True Ecu-menism (1972); Dr. Mildred Jefferson, M.D.** - as a leader in the Pro-Life Movement (1978); Habitat for Humanity - for making available housing for the poor (1999); Sister Helen Prejean - for being an advocate for those on death row, their victims, their families, and the families of their victims (2003) and Fran Heitzman, the founder of Bridging for helping families to furnish homes with hope (2014).

For 58 years the Franciscan International Award Dinner has been an opportunity for retreatants and friends of the retreat house to gather and honor an individual or organization that represents the spirit and ideals of St. Francis of Assisi. Since this is the **50th Anniversary of the Retreat House's establishment in Prior Lake**, we are extending a special invitation to friends old and new to be present for the Franciscan International Award Dinner.
