Notes from the Finance Committee:

The end financial results for the month of May was within budget with Expenses exceeding Revenues by approximately \$7,000 for the month. This was to be expected within the 2016 budget. However, both Revenues and Expenses were higher than expected. On the revenue side, total collections for general giving, as well as Sonshine, exceeded Budget for the month, reversing the trend from the prior month. Revenues were strong enough in May to now be close to budget for the year through the first five months. We are excited to report this as we remind our members that our budget was based on growth of over 10%. To be where we are now is very exciting!

May, however, was also very heavy on the expense side. Many of the little improvements throughout the church were recorded as maintenance items in the month of May. While the items such as HVAC and office improvements were needed and the expenses were low related to them, they were still expenses and drove the costs up. Additionally, the three weekly services we held throughout the month of May caused a spike in personnel expenses. With summer approaching and services at one per week, that item has already come back in line.

Once again, the cost related to the visioning strategy are also within expectation with Revenues after Expenses better than budgeted. Finance would like to remind members that the approved plan for the Visioning Process for 2016 included approximately \$95,000 worth of expenses in the first year, necessary to put the church where we want it to be. The process of securing this short-term financing has begun. Any additional revenues will help minimize what is required to cover. Please consider this as you review your giving to the church and its mission.

We are glad to you have chosen to be members at Holy Trinity and look forward to seeing you at Church this summer.

<u>Operations (Systems)</u> - energy audit favorable to HTLC, Revelations software review, Communications team in formation and will work on website, social media and newspaper ads/articles. (See attached)

Shared Ministries – Rib Fest is 7/29 (last day of VBS)

Hospitality Team - food portion is working well; welcoming team is needed along with its process and procedure.

Youth Ministry - Sonja serving as interim, VBS, summer camp and discussing education component for Wednesday evening services.

Mission & Vision Discussion: Drafts of both crafted and emailed to Council for review.

Mission: "Embraced by God's grace, HT is called to invite and accept all into a community which shares God's word and peace."

<u>Vision:</u> "HT provides a safe, engaging positive community for all to experience and share God's grace and peace."

Pastor's Report: June will provide time to work on Strategic Plan initiatives, crisis management plan, and prepare for Fall Macedonia Ministry membership to continue with one-time fee of \$500. Pastor Erick will write articles for the Working Preacher.

Treasurers Report: Trachte reported April was \$4,800 behind budget. \$4,600 over in expenses and \$10,000 off for the year.

Old Business: Wednesday Night Service - discussion on whether or not to continue Wednesday evening services through summer. Decision made to end them in May and continue back up in the Fall.

Rib Fest – team needs will determine non-profit to donate proceeds too and will report to Council in June.

Ministry Site Profile - call committee to spend time on it and Council will review and approve new members in June



All are welcome to Amazing Grays (senior coffee). We get together every Wednesday at 9:00 a.m. and enjoy a monthly road trip outing, usually on the first Thursday of each month.

June was another fun month for our group! We had excellent attendance at our Wednesday coffee hours, and for our group road trip, we traveled to Owatonna where we toured the Minnesota State Public School Orphanage Museum and enjoyed lunch together at the The Kernel Restaurant. In 1885, a new welfare policy in Minnesota helped to create the State Public School for Dependent and Neglected Children and would become a state-of-the art institution. Owatonna was chosen as the site for the school. The institution was self-sustaining. In addition to the school (orphanage), other buildings included a nursery, hospital, gymnasium, laundry, and residences for employees and the superintendent. The school had its own power plant, greenhouse, ice house, underground tunnel system, cemetery, and complete farm with crops and animals. Between 1886-1945 (when the school closed), there were 10,635 children that lived at the state school orphanage. The tour was very informative and well conducted. We learned a lot that day!

On Thursday, July 7th, our group will tour the New Prague wastewater treatment facility, followed by lunch at Charlie's on Prior in Prior Lake. We will meet at church at 9:45 a.m. and return by 2:00 p.m. The sign-up sheet is on the back bulletin board.

Suggestions for topics at weekly get-together and monthly road trip events are encouraged and welcome.

Jeremy's Council letter to the Holy Trinitarians (July 2016)

I am one of the four new council persons at Holy Trinity. My wife, Tracy and I have been members at Holy Trinity since 2013 when we moved from St. Cloud. Tracy is a Special Ed Teacher at Falcon Ridge where our two children Lilly (8) and Jack (7) attend. I buy and sell used heavy construction equipment in Lakeville. Before we moved, we did a lot of research on our new town. After looking at several towns in the area, we chose New Prague for a few reasons. First it's fifteen to tweny miles from everywhere. To me being that far away, meant that people had to put a little extra effort into living there. Second there are good schools. My wife, being a teacher, couldn't say enough about test scores, district philosophy, and opportunities for all students. Lastly, the final decision came down to a conversation we had with Mary Deutsch. "Basically," he said, "it comes down to a couple of reasons you should like New Prague. People pay their bills...and mow their lawns on Saturday." That made complete sense to me. People take pride in their town and their community. We made the decision right then and there. Shortly after we moved, we attended a couple of services at Holy Trinity. We recognized a few people we'd met recently and the congregation seemed to just fit our family. The church was very welcoming...even when our kids were a handful at church. I remember reading Paul Newton's letter in the newsletter talking about kids and church. I knew we weren't alone and there were others in the same boat; doing the right things for themselves and their kids.

My wife and I made a deal with each other to get involved in the community once we got here. Tracy is the Assistant Coach for NPHS Swimming and Diving Team, Assistant Coach for the Girl Scouts Swim Club, on the Pool Committee and the Parent Advisory Committee at Falcon Ridge. I help coach baseball, serve on the Rib Fest and Endowment Committees, and have offered my voice on the Church Council. I look forward to serving on the council, the Congregation, and helping to maintain a solid foundation at Holy Trinity so that others can have the same great experience we've had for the last three years.

I'm also looking forward to Rib Fest on July 29th. The committee has been working hard to put the event together. We're hoping that it goes well enough to make it an annual signature event where we can put Holy Trinity in the spotlight for a few hours and raise our profile in the community. Since it's our first run, I encourage the congregation to purchase tickets in advance to help with an accurate head count for food and; beverage preparation. We want to make sure we have enough food and drink and that everyone feels welcome.

A History of Hymns: America the Beautiful

O beautiful for spacious skies, for amber waves of grain; for purple mountain majesties above the fruited plain!
America! America! God shed his grace on thee, and crown thy good with brotherhood from sea to shining sea.

In the summer of 1892, Katharine Lee Bates (1859-1929), traveled from Massachusetts to teach at Colorado College. Bates, a Wellesley professor of English Literature and already a published poet, passed through the rolling fields of grain, through the wilderness of the West, eventually reaching the summit of Pike's Peak while riding a mule. Inspired by the sight of the Rocky Mountains from over 14,000 feet, she wrote the first version of the poem, *America the Beautiful. Bates writes, "It was there, as I was looking out over the sea-like expanse of fertile country spreading away so far under the ample skies, that the opening lines of the text formed themselves in my mind."*

The poem was first published on July 4, 1895 by The Congregationalist. After a revision, it was published again in 1904 by the Boston Evening Transcript and met with great acclaim. In 1918, it was further simplified to be paired with the hymn tune "Materna" by composer and organist Samuel Ward (1848-1903). Mr. Ward had originally written this hymn tune to be joined with an alternate hymn, but many congregations at the time found the lyrical melody and the eloquent poem to be a better match.

Katharine Bates taught for forty years at Wellesley College and eventually became the head of the English department. She also wrote and edited more than twenty books. Upon her death in 1929, there was a motion to replace *The Star Spangled Banner with America the Beautiful as our country's national anthem. Though it was voted down, many today still argue this point. Singer/ songwriter Ray Charles (1930-2004), clearly in this camp, is quoted as saying, "Honestly, wouldn't you rather sing about the beauty of America?"*



Summer has not slowed us down at Sonshine! During the month of June, we held a morning summer camp for six days. We welcomed a few families from Holy Trinity, as well as current Sonshine preschoolers, and some of them brought their younger siblings along. It was a great mix of kids and we can't wait to do it again next year! Our camp was FULL this year! Our themes were "Mini Minnesotans" and "Nature Explorers." It was fun to put our normal curriculum aside and concentrate on our great State of Minnesota, and the AWESOME nature that God has provided for us.

We are now ready to get our classrooms ready for the 2016-2017 school year! If you, or someone you know, are looking for a Christian Preschool experience, please give us a call and come tour our preschool! Our entire staff are teacher qualified, and certified in CPR & First Aid. We are licensed by the State of Minnesota, and follow a kindergarten readiness curriculum that follows the Minnesota State standards for kindergarten readiness. Everyone is welcome at Sonshine Preschool regardless of your religious affiliation.

As we prepare for a new school year, we are seeking some volunteers who would be interested in doing a few simple woodworking projects for us that will help improve our classrooms. If you have some free time on your hands and would like to help us out, please let us know! We are also searching for one or two large wooden spools for a project in one of our classroom centers, and a volunteer to dump our can trailer as it is now reaching towards the top full of cans!
