Tarana Burke, founder of the #MeToo movement, is leading a revolution to raise awareness of the pervasiveness of sexual assault in our society. For many, the very concept of love is broken, scarred by experiences, or threats of abuse disguised as love. One by one, women are speaking up to proclaim, "This is not right, and this is not love."

The Holy Week story shows that Jesus is no stranger to the voices of hurt, hatred, and abuse. But we also see in Jesus the demonstration of something much more powerful than rage, anger, and violence. In Jesus, we see what love IS. This is a love that willingly knelt down to wash the feet of his closest disciples. This is a love that offered the meal of forgiveness to the very lips that would soon betray him with a kiss. And this is a love, as he was nailed to the cross, cried out to God, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing."

For Jesus, this love wasn't accidental, it was intentional. Jesus didn't fall in love with this world, he stepped into it, knowing full well what it would mean for him.

don't know about you, but sometimes I'm tempted to feel defeated. This message of humble love seems to get lost in the yelling, accusations, and loudness of our world grasping for control, power, fame, and self-gratification. And it's right about now that Christians across the globe turn to Easter.

It's after the yelling and shouting, mocking and name-calling, after the beating and hurting, weeping and gasping that the soft dew clothed the flowers of the garden that calm and quiet Sunday morning. As the sun gently rose over the tomb, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome were startled to discover the central message of the Christian faith. While the unconditional love of God led to the suffering of Jesus on the cross, the Gospel doesn't end at Good Friday. The fullness of Good News, our hope, our foundation for the Christian faith comes not in the form of a love that suffers, dies, and is buried. Our love, our salvation, and our Easter proclamation is found in a love that is alive.

Maybe it is time we borrow new terms and metaphors for love from Jesus. This is a love that is purposeful and intentional. This is a love that serves, forgives, nourishes, and washes clean. The apostle Paul picked up on this in his letter to the Corinthians; he wrote about a love that is patient and kind, not envious, boastful, arrogant, or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful. Because of the Good News of Easter, this is a love that never ends. This is a Love Alive!

Kim's Council letter to the Holy Trinitarians (March 2018)

This month I am going to be talking about a couple of relatively new teams at Holy Trinity.

Last Fall council agreed that we should form a Risk Management Team. This is not in response to any event, but rather council's desire to be proactive and address issues before there is an issue. Hopefully we will never need to use any of the plans we are implementing. Team members are Pr. Alicia, Paul Newton and myself. As different topics are addressed, we will invite members of the community and Holy Trinity for their input. For example, at this time Jon Berquist is aiding us with information about the building and helping prepare a building risk management assessment and response.

When we started the process, we believed it would be a relatively easy and would be done quickly. We realized we needed a plan in place in case of inclement weather or a medical emergency. As the process progressed we realized there were many other issues to discuss. Often, we rely on volunteers to help with operations (ushers, Sunday School Teachers, Crew Time Leaders etc.) there is information those volunteers should know and we needed a plan in place to distribute this information to the volunteers. Also, our church is increasingly being rented out by other groups for events, and those individuals also need the information.

Some examples of what we addressed are what to do in case of bad weather, what if a water pipe breaks-who knows where the water shut off is, or what if there is a medical emergency? Our insurance company has given us access to resources which helped us identify issues and begin creating a plan.

The team has been meeting on a regular basis and has addressed the following so far.

*Signage for the AED which is located by the south entrance of the church *Training given by Tim Thorpe to council members and ushers on use of AED *Tour of building with Jon Berquist showing location of flashlights and first aid kits *Background checks of volunteers working at Hope House and visitation ministry *Installation of landline in hallway-we realized that if there is an emergency often the office is locked and there would be a possi bility that no one in attendance would know the lock code. During worship people might not have their cell phones with them. *Creation of weather policy. If school is cancelled activities at the church are cancelled, with the exception of worship. Pastor Ben will make the call on when to cancel worship. However, you make the call on your own level of comfort. If you are uncomfortable braving the elements to attend worship then don't. Safety of our congregation is our first concern. Cancellations will be announced on KCHK radio 1350 AM 95.5 FM and will be put on the church's Facebook page. You might have already seen notice of the can cellation policy in the church bulletin.

In the coming months we will be working on the risk management document and reviewing the building rental agreement.

How does this impact you? For now, the Risk Management Team wants you to know there is an AED near the south entrance of the church and there are first aid kits in the Welcome Center, Paul's Place, Sonshine and the kitchen. There are flashlights in the Welcome Center. There is a landline in the kitchen and in the hallway outside of the worship center (the one by the restrooms).

If you have any questions, concerns or ideas for items we could address please contact one of the team members. We are always open to suggestions. We will be updating the congregation periodically on our progress.

I still don't know where the water valve shut off is, but plan on learning at an upcoming meeting ③

This month I also want to mention the re- established Prayer Shawl Ministry. We had a prayer shawl ministry several years ago but it had fizzled out. Prayer shawls are a particular passion of mine. After the formal group was no longer meeting, I kept knitting prayer shawls and distributing them when I heard of a need. Late last summer, Kate Kienow asked if I would be open to restarting the ministry. Her family had been the recipient of a prayer shawl and she was touched by the ministry. I immediately answered yes. With new pastors coming on board and the holidays approaching we decided to wait until the new year to meet.

Our first meeting was held Saturday January 13 at 9 a.m. and were pleased to have about a dozen attendees, both knitters and crocheters. A couple of our attendees had been involved in prayer shawl ministry at previous churches, it is great to get their insight on how to maintain a successful ministry. All levels of skill were represented, advanced down to those who wanted to be a part of the ministry but needed to learn how to knit or crochet. We were able to obtain a grant from Thrivent and so have a stash of yarn and some extra needles. Come to the next meeting and try it. We meet the second Saturday of the month in the Fireside room at 9 a.m. Meetings typically last 60-90 minutes. You don't have to stay the entire time, come late or leave early if you need to. Our wish is that it is a non-stressful group, never feel like you have to attend every month, you don't have to come to any meetings, just take yarn and knit. If you need a prayer shawl there are some completed ones in the cupboard in the Fireside room feel free to take one. Or there are prayer shawl request forms in the box outside Jamie's office. If you want to knit or crochet on your own, you can complete a prayer shawl and put it in the bin in the cupboard in the Fireside room. If you have any questions contact Kate Kienow or myself. I will still never love writing but with God's help and congregational support I know now that I can do it. Small lesson learned no matter how big or small the issue, God leads the way.
