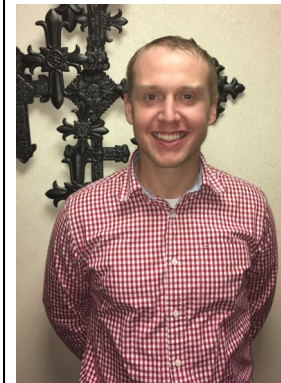

Not everyone will agree, but for a church nerd like me, a meeting with a former Bishop of the ELCA is a pretty awesome experience! This spring, I had the privilege of having lunch with former presiding Bishop of the ELCA and retired president of the Lutheran World Federation, Mark Hanson. He graciously met with me and shared his wisdom and experiences navigating change.

According to Bishop Hanson, “We need to know the difference between ‘memory’ and ‘nostalgia.’” Memory is fruitful; it grounds us in a foundational story that propels us forward in a consistent manner. Nostalgia is dangerous; it can trap us in a distorted perspective of a reality that was probably never as desirable as we might remember it being.

On May 20th, churches around the globe will celebrate the birth of the early church from the book of Acts, Chapter 2, also known as the story of Pentecost. As we prepare for this special day, I think about how, at times, the Church can point to this day in a nostalgic tone. When the Christian church began, there was a robust passion for the Gospel, a communal commitment to spreading it, and a concern for sharing all things in common. Sometimes we hear people say, “Wouldn’t all our church problems be solved if we could just be like the early church?”

David Lose, senior pastor at Mount Olivet Lutheran Church in Minneapolis, notes on his May 16th, 2010 blog (www.workingpreacher.org) that one of the worst things churches can do on festivals such as Pentecost is to commemorate it. While it is important to ground our story in important biblical stories, he writes, “There is nothing more resistant to purposeful, hopeful action in the present than nostalgia, the sentimental longing for a bygone era.”

So how can we celebrate Pentecost without being nostalgic? How can we honor the work of the Spirit, without commemorating it?

The story of Pentecost tells how the Holy Spirit unexpectedly begins working through new voices and new languages. This month, Holy Trinity has ample opportunity to witness the ways in which God is speaking to and through new voices today. Here are a few examples coming our way:

- On the week of May 6th, we welcome Pastor Jorge Luis Espinoza Perez, who is being commissioned by the Minneapolis Area Synod to pursue a Latino ministry in Scott County. We are invited to be a part of this important movement of the spirit in our own backyard.
- On the week of May 13th, we will welcome the latest group of New Members to Holy Trinity, those people whom God has called to join in the mission and ministry of Holy Trinity.
- On May 20th, Pentecost Sunday, our worship will be led by Holy Trinity’s senior high school class members. Graduating senior Joe Taylor will be preaching!

As we hear these voices and honor these people, we are witnesses to the Spirit at work, in 2018, in New Prague, MN, at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church.

I have to say, while a number of churches are struggling to see beyond their nostalgia, it is SO FUN to be a part of a church that is rooted in the ELCA tradition, yet excited about what God is doing new today. We look backwards so that we can look outwards at the Spirit’s work in the here and now. This is the Pentecost for today!

Ministry Team Reports: Benevolence committee (Winn) has 10 members. Held initial meeting on February 28th. Another meeting scheduled the Wednesday after Easter. Kienow gave update on Risk Management team. Doing background checks on all staff as part of routine risk management practices. CYFM (Shoenebeck) met with multiple people to gain background on structure and also attended a Sonshine board meeting as well as a CYFM team meeting to gain knowledge. Faith Formations (Thorp) held a small meeting March 11th. Looking at later in the spring to get going. Communications (Jacobson) getting youth involved for their input. Kienow suggested giving brief ministry team updates in letters to the congregation in the church newsletter.

Pastor Alicia Report:

ELCA regional gift planner meeting with endowment team to draft giving policy for council review. Policy would outline how to deal with unexpected gifts to the church and how to designate. Gift planner would also speak to the congregation both in group and individually to help estate planning. Draft of organizational chart came out of council retreat. Next step to meet with each stakeholder and a stakeholder meeting. April 8th and April 11th will feature an Emmaus service. Next new member gathering May 6th.

Pastor Ben Report:

Holy week – reminded all to hear the story anew. CYFM – Had 29 as part of first communion group. Held 2 different classes. One on Sunday and one on Wednesday evening. National youth gathering special day in April. Special musician Rachel Kurtz who is performing at youth gathering will be at Holy Trinity on April 22nd. Fire suppression system finished. April 21st is a scheduled cleaning day.

Treasurer Report

Overall February actuals came in at -\$3,786, better than budgeted deficit of -\$8,748. Upside was due to a shift of Sonshine revenue from January and increased hospitality giving. First principal payment on loan also paid in February versus interest only in previous month. On track for balanced budget for fiscal year after two actualized periods.

Old Business:

Endowment distributions – Kienow outlined need for council say on endowment approvals for a couple reasons. One is to validate cash on hand to distribute. Second is to align endowment and council goals and a method to provide safety check on distributions. Constitutional changes – waiting on the synod for a couple clarifications before we can proceed.

New Business

Wednesday worship schedule – survey results regarding Wednesday service time with crew time and confirmation. Results suggest overwhelming support for 6PM service time with large group breakouts for CYFM. Suggest to run this through the end of May before we make a long term decision. Three lakeside services are being planned as way to increase engagement in the summer. More details to come in next meeting. Property task force – Pastor Ben gave background into concessions given for building addition in 2004 that are now impacting church today such as road extension and closing Hwy 19 access. Kienow explained that property task force will facilitate conversations to look at construction options and bring back to council for consideration.

Berger motioned to reconvene Property Task Force led by John Bergquist to explore construction options and work as a liaison to finance team to discuss financing options. 2nd by Thorp. Passed 9-0 including both pastors.

Thank you to Holy Trinity Lutheran Church for hosting space for us to lead Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University 9-week course. Thank you to Brandi and Lexi for supervising the childcare for each week's class. Here is an overview of the class that took place in February and March of this year.

- *12 families registered, 10 completing the course
- *During the 9-week course the total financial impact to the families reporting combined (9 families reporting)
 - *Non-mortgage debt eliminated = \$51,327
 - *Money saved = \$25,159
 - *Credit cards cancelled/cut = 35
- *Participants provided feedback that the course helped them to:
 - *Become more accountable to themselves and their partner and to see where their money goes.
 - *Pay off credit cards and close cards that were not being used.
 - *Teach their children better financial techniques.
 - *Think twice before you buy.
 - *Give more in donations.
 - *Open-up communication with their partner about money (some had never really communicated with their partner about finances). Multiple families stated they have noticed an overall improvement in their relationship as a result of this open communication.
 - *Feel hope for the future and what financial freedom will allow for their family.
- *Testimony from one family who attended the course - "Our Dave Ramsey class with Amber and Nate was such a positive and wonderful experience. It truly made us take a hard look at our financial state and forced us to make some tough decisions. Because of the motivation of the group and the guidance of Amber and Nate, we have been able to pay off three credit cards and have shaved two years off of our debt!"

George's Council letter to the Holy Trinitarians (May 2018)

Joan and I joined Holy Trinity Lutheran Church shortly after our marriage in July of 1966. 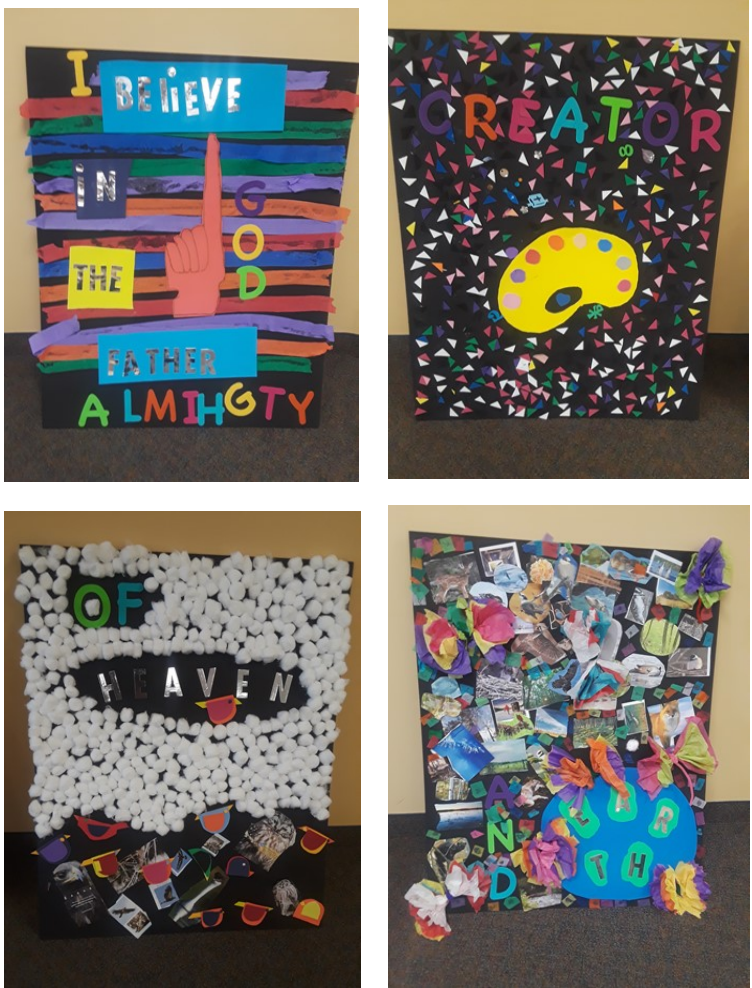
