#### Baptized? Never too old or too young...

#### never too soon or too late!

- An active adult in the church- "I am an adult but I didn't grow up in the Lutheran Church so I have never been baptized. Can I take communion? Should I be baptized?"
- A parent of three- "We have been moving around for my spouse's job for the last 5 years and are finally in a place for more than a few years and are eager to have our kids a part of a church. They are not babies anymore. Is it too late for them to be baptized?
- A young adult- "I want to be a part of this community. The church I grew up in practiced believer's baptism, and I was never baptized. Do you do that here?"
- A new parent- "I just had a baby and am not a member. Can my child be baptized? What is required? What does it mean?"
- A person in the third third of their life, facing a terminal illness- "I want to know I am not alone. I want to know I can count on someone now and beyond this life. I have not been baptized. How can I find comfort through faith?"

These are just a few questions that people have asked me regarding baptism. If you have asked them or wondered them, you are not alone. Because of God's grace, Lutherans are good at inviting infants to be baptized, showing there is nothing we can do to earn God's love. But sometimes people who weren't baptized as infants feel uncomfortable admitting it or funny asking about it. The truth is, the Bible is full of stories of people from all ages and all life circumstances being baptized. If you, or someone you know, has not been baptized and would like to be, there is a great opportunity coming up to consider. On Wednesday, August 22<sup>nd</sup>, we have our last Holy Trinity Lakeside Service for the year at Cedar Lake Farm Regional Park. While most any Sunday/Wednesday worship service is an appropriate and fitting place for someone to be baptized at any age/stage of life, we are planning one particular worship service for people of any age to come down, stand in the water at Cedar Lake, and be baptized. On Wednesday, August 22<sup>nd</sup>, we will have a picnic style supper (starting at 5 pm) followed by a worship service at Cedar Lake Farm Regional Park (6 pm).

We have five baptisms of people of varying ages scheduled for the lake that night and would love to include others in this celebration. It will happen in the service, as usual, but the setting is simply quite conducive for older children/adults to be baptized. If have are interested in being baptized or have questions about this opportunity, please call the church office or speak to one of the pastors.

Baptism is a time of celebration. It is a welcome into the body of Christ and into the mission we

share. Every time we have a baptism, it is a celebration, so expect a celebration on Wednesday, August 22<sup>nd</sup>. Boom Chicka Boom will be leading our music during our worship service as well as a concert following the service. Mark your calendars for this exciting celebratory evening!

#### Pastor Alicia Report:

Fall Planning – Pastor Alicia met with Sunday School teachers, Crew Time Leaders, and CYFM team – what went well, what can be done better with decision to maintain Sunday School with one class of Pre-K and one of elementary and Crew Time with the same structure during Wednesday service message.

RibFest – 5pm – 8pm August 3<sup>rd</sup>; hosted on front lawn of HTLC.

Pre-Marriage Retreat – All staff that partners with weddings participated. We had four couples attend with the Privratskys and Jaspersons sharing their wisdom regarding marriage.

Vacation – Pastor Alicia and Pastor Ben have vacation plans this summer; they've coordinated for pastoral back-up and with five church members to assist with services.

Strategic Plan – Stakeholders met on June 3<sup>rd</sup> and will be summarizing in written form what was accomplished, what was not/why and what is still outstanding. Luke Friendshuh will consolidate the information and it will be highlighted at annual meeting.

#### Pastor Ben Report:

Granola Bar Drive – Liz Nelson led a drive to ask for 1,000 granola bars in June. By June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2,700 had been donated. HTLC has created an outdoor 24/7 food shelf on the church grounds.

#### **Treasurers Report:**

YTD – Budget at end of May was \$1,511 with actuals at -\$4,944. We had a good month of giving, yet had some expense hit in May that was budgeted spend throughout the summer (Sonshine salaries). Kienow, Fiala, and Pastor Alicia met with First National to renew line of credit.

#### **Old Business:**

Congregational Gift Policy – Council reviewed draft. Pastor Alicia will ask some follow-up questions and return to council for final review/vote.

Mission/Vision Statement Next Steps – Work done by 2016 church council was reviewed; council is thoughtfully considering next steps on how to formulate mission/vision.

Road Bids/Work – Engineering is being prepared and will be submitted to city for approval.

#### **New Business:**

Legal Church Name/State Filings – Our legal church name is Holy Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church, New Prague, Minn. Facility Needs Discussion – Pastor Ben recommended a task force be established to review our current facility composition, our needs, and make recommendations relative to future needs. We will leverage nominating committee for the composition of this team.

Closing Prayer: Berger led council in prayer.

**Meeting Adjourned:** Motion by Gassner, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Klingfus. Motion passed. Meeting adjourned at 8:28 p.m.

Greetings,

How connected do you feel to God? How connected do you feel to your fellow church members? One of the challenges of a church Holy Trinity's size is helping people maintain those connections. 

I hope you are having a great summer! As we gear up for the fall, I just wanted to let you know that I'm super excited to be jumping into Children's Ministry. It's something I care deeply about, and I'm looking forward to getting to know all of you! Here are a couple really great options for how you can engage this fall:



I believe that the single most important way you can pass on the Christian faith to your young ones is

through weekly worship. At Holy Trinity, we want parents to know that we welcome children in worship, even with their occasional restlessness and temper tantrums! Each service, we have a children's message, and we also have a noisy offering so that even the youngest ones in church can begin to learn the practices of faith. You can also help yourself to a kid's worship bag, which includes crayons for them to use on the "Coloring Corner" of the bulletin. In addition, our nursery has recently been updated with new toys, and it includes both a "mother's room" and a private bathroom, with the worship service livestreamed.

#### Crew Time (Wednesday nights):

#### **Confirmation Layout**

- <u>5:00 Dinner</u>: This is optional, but a wonderful chance to have a home cooked meal in the middle of a busy week!
- <u>6:00 Worship</u>: Worship is central to a life of faith, and central to the Holy Trinity Confirmation Experience.
- <u>6:50 Small Groups</u>: After worship, students will break into small groups to check in and discuss their sermon notes.
- <u>7:10-7:30 Large Group</u>: Students and leaders will then regroup in Paul's Place for a large group lesson.

#### Key Components

- Weekly Participation: Students will be expected to participate weekly in worship, small groups, and the large group lessons.
- <u>Sermon Notes</u>: During worship, students will take sermon notes on the backs of the bulletins, which they will hand into their small group leaders.
- <u>Service Teams</u>: Rather than accumulating separate service hours, students will jump into one of three service teams:
  - Worship Support Team (1x/month): this team will be in charge of helping with worship (ushering, A/V, reading, etc.)
  - <u>Kitchen Team</u> (1x/month): this team will help the kitchen team serve and clean up the Wednesday dinner meal.
  - <u>Bell Choir (1x/month)</u>: students can volunteer to play in the Bell Choir! They will practice at 5pm the same day they play at 6pm.
