It is the sequel to the Gospel of Luke and picks up where Luke ends. It is a picture into the life of the church at its very inception. It is a book full of questions, adventures, crises and consequences in the early church.


Summer is a good time to get out of the box and while we often focus our preaching in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, this summer we are going to focus on part 2, Acts. After Jesus died and was raised, God sent the Holy Spirit to breathe life into the church and after that there was nothing that could hold the Spirit's movement back.

Acts is a story of movement. It is like the ripples of water moving out after a rock is thrown into the water. The whole book is summarized in Acts 1:8 "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Acts is the story of God's good news moving out from the center, Jerusalem, to Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

This summer, we will wonder, along with the first believers, some of the same pertinent questions of faith. How much power does God give to God's people after he is no longer physically present? Does being a Christian mean that life will be easier? Who can be a part of the church? What is conversion? Who can or should be a leader in the church? Where do differing beliefs about baptism come from?

This summer is a great time to let the Word move you to a new place- to get you out of your normal routine. In addition to regular weekly worship, we have some special worship services coming up including: Blessing of the Bikes (6/5), Vacation Bible School Worship (7/10), Blessing of the Pets (7/31), a Polka Service (8/4), Blessing of the Backpacks (8/21), and Holy Trinity Lakeside (6/26, 7/24, 7/28). 

We need your Time, your Talents and your Tools

Holy Trinity is a very active church community. As a result it takes increasing amounts of time and talent to keep everything in working order and presentable for our congregational and community needs. We are looking for anyone who would like to participate in maintaining the church property. The commitments are generally small in nature. We are not looking for long term project involvement, generally one day or less. Currently our project list includes removal of a pine tree on the east side of the church, re-plumbing of a water heater in the Sacristy, scraping and painting the parking lot light poles, cleaning the carpet in several meeting areas, several painting projects in interior spaces like classrooms, kitchen and hallways, ongoing repair of tables and chairs, and clearing debris from the flat roof area. There are always new projects that come up.

The commitment could be to either the Interior Space Committee or the Property Committee. The Interior Space Committee handles painting, interior repairs, decorating and general care, condition and look of the interior of the church.

The Property Committee handles the maintaining, retrofitting and remodeling of all systems of the church facility, including lighting, plumbing, woodworking and carpentry, as well as exterior maintenance and landscaping.

We also need to know what you have for tools and equipment. The church doesn't have the funds to purchase all of the equipment needed to maintain a facility so we rely on our congregational members to assist us with items that we use such as backpack blowers, dethatchers, aerators, chain saws, large ladders, trailers, skid loaders, trucks and other large tools used only occasionally.

In order to be able to find you when we need you, we need a couple things. First your name and contact information, including best phone numbers and email addresses. Then let us know if you can help us with tools and equipment that you have access to that could be used on the property. And finally, what skills and talents can you bring to the table and how would you like to be involved. We want to make sure we are making best use of the talents available to us and we want you to be involved in projects that you enjoy.

I know there are many who have voiced their willingness and it's difficult to keep track of everyone. Setting up a data base of Time, Talent and Tools will help us complete our tasks successfully and get people involved with the church community where they feel most comfortable.
