Baptism Service

I had never done this before.

Several people were there, relying on me, ready to be baptized, and I was supposed to know how to do this. But I didn't. So I asked a Baptist pastor friend for help, and he gave me some good advice. This ended up being one of the most moving worship services of my life.

At the Holy Trinity Lakeside service in August 2018, we had 7 baptisms (pictured below). These were not baby baptisms. And they were baptized in the lake!



You see, Lutherans are good at infant baptisms. Our theology confirms that God's grace comes to us before we deserve it. Baptism is a gift from God, a promise that nothing can separate us from the love of God through Christ Jesus our Lord. We baptize babies because baptism is God's act, not ours.

What happens if you were not baptized as an infant? Does that make you less of a Christian? If you want a baptism, should you go to a non-denominational church with a pool? Or can Lutherans do this, too?

As I prepared for this service, I came to a deeper understanding of the history of Christian baptisms. I realized that while our Lutheran theology allows for infant baptism, our Biblical tradition speaks of primarily adult baptisms. In the history of the early church, families were sometimes baptized together because they knew that identifying as a Christian could be a life or death matter. As the church grew, Christianity left the margins and entered the mainstream. During this period of time, baptism as infants became normalized and remains so today. But that doesn't mean that a non-infant baptism is in any way a backup plan.

Maybe you weren't brought up in the church. Maybe your family didn't like or trust the pastor who would baptize you. Maybe your church at that time practiced believer's baptisms. Maybe you were waiting to schedule a time when the godparents could come into town, and now it's five years later.

I believe that each of us have a faith story that is unique. While Lutherans encourage infant baptisms, that in no way makes non-infant baptisms inferior. Baptism is a gift from God, whether you're 7 days, 7 months, 7 years, or 70 years old.

So we're going to do it again. This year, it will be August 28th, once again at the Holy Trinity Lakeside service. If you've already been baptized already, then you're good to go. But if you haven't, if you have any interest, or if you know someone who might be interested, please don't hesitate to connect with Pastor Alicia or myself. We'd love to welcome you to this special baptism opportunity!

Guests: Pat and Mary O'Malley discussed their project on the history and time line of Holy Trinity. Plans for the future distribution and promotion within the church will follow this fall. Michael Busch presented on his time as a delegate to the Minneapolis Area Synod Assembly, detailing the resolutions presented and passed.

Pastor Alicia Report: Attended Gustavus Adolphus College Gathering of congregations, and Minneapolis Area Synod Assembly, new member class completed, Sunday School and Crew Time wrap up this week, focus turns to VBS week of July 8-11.

Pastor Ben Report: Attendance for Holy Week reviewed, special services throughout May highlighted, flier with planned services for summer discussed, Lakeside services last Wednesday in June, July and August, council members encourage to attend and act as greeters, hosts as they are able.

Wednesday summer services, acoustic guitar duo this year, meal before services also.

Mission report, great participation with Shoe Away Hunger, over 500 pairs of shoes.

Pastor Ben continues his Capstone project this Summer for Augsburg.

HVAC system identified as beginning to fail, bids for replacement/repair being gathered. Property to meet with building manager this week. Council to review once costs and plan final. Will require approval at congregational meeting. Current plan for garage purchase will not occur at this time to allow focus on HVAC.

Treasurer Report:

General giving for April slightly lower than budget, but on track for year to date. April expenses higher than anticipated: Sum paid for work compensation insurance being reviewed, had been budgeted in December, Chris Clausen to follow up. Quarterly office maintenance for printer service missed in budget for April, will be adjusted for 3rd /4th Quarter. Radio Broadcast payment also done in April, all combined to total Revenue to Expense to be \$-4995, compared to budget \$-108 for April.

Year to date, revenues exceed expenses by \$5622 compared to budget shortfall of \$4442. Over \$6000 of the \$9000 difference can be attributed to benevolence spending below budget.

Old Business: Child Protection policy final, copy provided can replace current copies in binder. Fall roll out scheduled, key people in place for implementation.


