My grandfather was a pastor. He is a significant inspiration for me: I wear his alb every Sunday and say his final benediction at most services. I miss him, as he died in 2010 after a battle with dementia. He didn't get a chance to know me as pastor, and there are days I would love the chance to "talk shop" with him.

After his death, I went to a workshop on dementia. I learned that people with dementia do not necessarily lose memories, but they lose the ability to access them. I learned that our memories are complex stories, with bits and pieces of the memory located in different locations in the brain. Smells, emotions, sounds, settings, people, voices, and tastes are stored in different and multiple places.



The presenter unpacked the word "remember." He said to think of remembering like re-membering, where re-membering involves re-connecting the members, or parts of the experience into a more complete picture. Sometimes people with dementia have a difficult time remembering because they can't re-member the various parts of the memory. The individual parts of the memory may be there, but the connections between them are lost.

I've never thought of "remembering" the same way again. Because remembering is less about resurfacing old information, but re-membering is re-assembling individual components into a cohesive memory. Furthermore, re-membering is also about making connections between something that happened before with something happening today.

Faith is all about re-membering. Throughout the Biblical story, there's a continued emphasis on remembering. Remember God's covenant with Abraham (Exodus 2). Eat and drink in remembrance of me (Luke 22). As we gather for worship today, we remember God's promises for our ancestors because we need to connect them to ourselves. We remember how God has worked in the world before, so that we can make connections with how God is at work in the world today.

Throughout this 2019-20 year, Holy Trinity is embarking on a 4-phase vision process. This first phase of the 2020 Vision process is "Looking Backward." At the Backward Huddle on Sept. 15th, Chris Loose told the story that Holy Trinity began with three women who had a vision for a church. God worked through them to make it happen. In the same way, Chris told us that we can do the same. This is how God works in the world: through normal people like you and me and the visions that we have.

Stories like this matter because they help us know how to go forward. When we remember what God's Covenant was for Abraham, when we remember stories from the beginnings of Holy Trinity, we see that we are connected. We re-member ourselves with our ancestors, we re-member our todays with our yesterdays. Just as God has worked through our ancestors of this church and ancestors of the faith, so too will God act through this new generation as we seek to be faithful in the year 2020 and beyond.

Each Sunday that I wear my slightly stained alb, and each service that I lift my hand for the final benediction, I remember my grandfather. Even though he hasn't seen me preach, and even though we can't "talk shop", as I remember him, I re-member myself with him. We are still members of the same team, the body of Christ. For that, I am forever grateful!

LOOKING BACKWARD













Dozinky Parade


