Looking Inward: This is Us

It has been said that churches need to look up, look in, and look out to be balanced and healthy. You've probably heard people comment about when one or another is out of balance. When a church in unbalanced, some might say a church is: "too heavenly minded to be any earthly good" (upward), or "too insider focused" (inward), or "focused on serving but not depth and discipleship" (outward). We want to be a church that is balanced. We want to look for God's leading (upward), look inward at the gifts and deep faith of God's people, and look outward at the needs in our community and world.



As you know, this year we are embarking on a Vision 2020 process where we hope to listen to God, Holy Trinity, and the greater community/world in hopes of a crystal clear (20/20 you could say) mission and vision for Holy Trinity moving forward.

In-Reach: Through the months of November and December, a team of 20 visitors (trained by Deb Rogers of Beacon Interfaith Housing Network) will be conducting one-on-one conversations with the congregation. Thanks to Vision Team member Jackie Lee for coordinating this important effort. We sincerely hope that you participate in this process, because we want to hear about you! We want to hear your story, your passions, and your values as we continue this visioning process as a congregation. Please look to participate in a one-on-one conversation in the next couple months.

Dialogue Sermons: As we reflect on who God has brought to Holy Trinity, we will have a different format for our sermons during this Looking Inward Phase. Through a series of "conversations", we will listen to some stories of our church leaders in worship, through a dialogue sermon format.


