Time for Lent In This Issue:

What is Lent? Lent will begin on Ash Wednesday (Wednesday, Feb.26th). Lent means "lengthen." If you are like me, when you hear of the season when days are lengthening and we are nearing spring, you say, "thank goodness!" Lent is the season that leads up to spring. Lent is a sacred season of the church when people of faith make a commitment to faith practices as a way of preparing for Holy Week and Easter. It is a time of training, of creating healthy faith habits. Training, however, is rarely successfully done alone. We are much more successful in creating new habits and routines when we do them with others.

What practices do we encourage during Lent? As a church, we encourage you to take up three faith practices during Lent:



- 1) We always say "worship needs to be the first faith priority" but during Lent, we invite you to prioritize weekly worship
- 2) We will be having a congregation-wide small group experience when you are invited to jump into a small group for four weeks to share life and faith together for an hour
- 3) We will be handing out a Lenten Daily Devotional including writings by the people of HTLC and various ministry partners


Why take up a new faith practice? It is common for people of faith to make a commitment to selfdiscipline as we remember the 40 days when Jesus was tempted in the wilderness and needed to have self-discipline. This was a training period before his launching into ministry.

What will our theme be this year? The theme for this year during Lent will be "Dreamers." The Bible is full of people who have visions, dreams, and revelations. Sometimes God paints a picture of possibility through these methods. If we take time to stop, and focus on God through these three practices, we might similarly catch a glimpse of the future God has in store for us. Through Lent we are going to study a number of different biblical examples of people who had a vision, dream, or revelation that inspired them to answer God's call and live their life in a different way.

We hope you will take the invitation to experience the sacred season of Lent. This is a training season for people of faith, when we prepare for a life of faith together.

I look forward to this meaningful season of faith with you!

Motion: Approve agenda with moving 2020 Budget Review/Approval to after Treasurer report and 25 drive update. Kienow, second Dittberner, passed

Motion: Approve minutes November 18 meeting, Schoenebeck, second Klingfus: passed

Motion: Approve special meeting minutes November 25, Fiala, second Klingfus: passed

Devotions: Canoeing the Mountains Chapter 14,15 and general overview/recap

Treasurers report: Strong giving in November continues in December, no unexpected expenses, YTD tracking for 11-12% increase overall in revenue from 2018. Will end year with budget surplus. No unexpected changes, combining balance sheet reviewed.

Motion: Any surplus revenue over expenses of 2019 budget to be divided: 50% to debt reduction, 25% to capital fund, 25% to general fund for liquid operating expenses. Hemann, second Kienow: passed

25 Drive update: \$18900, 71 giving units, with 9 days left in the drive. 25 drive will be kept in short term designated fund with anticipated use beginning in May 2020.

2020 Budget Presentation: Overview of 2020 budget including personnel, maintenance, and building fund adjustments. Stewardship review indicates pledge cards total donation amounts up 8.1% from 2018, total card numbers increased 13.2% over 2018. On track for 11-12% increase in overall giving, land sale investment will continue to go to capital fund. Budget to be presenting in pre-meeting January 19, and annual meeting January 26 with final YTD 2019 update.

Pastor's Report: Thanksgiving Dinner, well attended and appreciated, Ladies Tea continues a nice tradition. 


HTLC hosts Conference Meeting
