What are your dreams for Holy Trinity? What do you see in our future?

Our theme during this season of Lent is Dreamers and we want to hear from you. Are you hesitant....nervous? Does it feel like a weird thing to do in the church? I'm not surprised.

Jesus faced religious leaders who preached that religion was about rules and regulations. They told people to learn where the lines are and to stay within them. Many times, that same attitude can be felt in the church today. But when we look to His ministry, we see that Jesus made sure faith wasn't just about following the rules. Faith also in-



volved wondrous miracles, breaking down barriers, daring to welcome the outcasts, feeding more people than what seemed possible, and picturing God's heavenly future and how that leaks into our world today.

Michael Yaconelli is considered a guru in the world of youth ministry. In his book Dangerous Wonder (1998), Yaconelli refers to Jesus as the "Dream Giver." The One who wants us to listen to His dream for us, and to give ourselves permission to dream as well. He writes, "We have forgotten how to dance, how to sing, and how to laugh. We have allowed technology to beat our imaginations into submission and have become tourists rather than travelers. Screens dominate our time, alter our values, numb us to life in all of its wildness" (p. 25). Yaconelli adds that, "somewhere along the way we had the child chased out of us. Our childlikeness is usually snuffed out by people who tell us what we can't do. They are dream stealers" (p. 26).

This Lent, let's push the limits.

Let's not be burdened by what we can't do. Let's not be silenced by the dream stealers. Rather, let's honor the vision of the prophet Joel:

"I will pour out my spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, and your young men shall see visions. Even on the male and female slaves, in those days, I will pour out my spirit." –Joel 2:28-29

Notice that it's the old and the young, the male and the female, the wealthy and the slave. When it comes to God's work in the world, all people have the chance to dream-and yes, that includes you!

As we enter the fourth and final phase of the Vision 2020 process, we are "Looking Forward." As we think about the future, we want to invite your dreams and visions of the future, even if you feel like they might be a little far-fetched or unrealistic. On Sunday, March 1st, we kick off this "Looking Forward" phase with a Vision Huddle, and we are intentionally putting young people in leadership roles. I believe our young people are not simply representing the future; those with a childlike faith just may not have had all their dreams stolen yet. Because of that, our young people just may be our best teachers in how to dream today.

Where can you start? It might involve letting your mind wander during a sermon. It might involve jumping into a small group and brainstorming ideas together. It might involve spending time in prayer after reading a Lenten devotional. In the words of Yaconelli, "It is time to find the place where the dangerous wonder of faith can be discovered-a place landscaped by risky curiosity, wild abandon, daring playfulness, quiet listening, irresponsible passion, happy terror, and naïve grace" (p. 32).

During this season of Lent, whether it's during worship, during your own devotional time, or during your small groups, give yourself permission to dream. To wonder. To ask, "What if?," or "Why can't we?".

Let's look forward to the future together!




Looking Forward Huddle



Lent is a season in the church year when we often prioritize spiritual practices. This year we would like to invite HTLC into three community faith practices during the season of Lent: 1) worship, 2) daily devotions, and 3) a four-week small group Bible study. Our theme for Lent is "Dreamers" and in each of these practices we will be reflecting on the dreams of some Bible figures and how we can relate to their dreams and visions in our own lives.

- 1. Worship: Join us this Lenten season for worship on Sundays at 9am and/or Wednesdays at 6pm. On Sundays, we will worship using a liturgy from the Gather hymnal's morning prayer. On Wednesdays, we will worship using the Holden Evening Prayer liturgy. Sermons will remain consistent at both services.


