


GIVING GOOD NEWS

Get to know Sande Schoenecker

What has been a bright spot during the COVID-19 social isolation? It is bittersweet that I share these positive moments with you. My father passed away in March after open heart surgery. It was truly a blessing to be with him for the 3 weeks before he died. I witnessed him being kind, compassionate, and grateful to everyone who entered his hospital room. He greeted every nurse, doctor, therapist, and housekeeper by their name. If he didn't know their name, he learned it quickly. Only one visitor was allowed per patient, but thankfully when end of life care was started, two of my siblings and myself were able to be with him.

As difficult as it was to sort through and pack up his belongings, I found several notes he had either printed or handwritten with words of scripture. Buried in his wallet, he had written the following verse on the back of a tattered note card: "Before they call, I will answer; while they are yet speaking, I will hear." Isaiah 65:24 Then he added: "Remember...God's love is stronger than my fear." One of his greatest fears was dying before my mother who has Alzheimer's. He lovingly cared for her until October 2019 when we helped him transition her to a nursing home. My father was a man of great faith who lived it daily.
