GIVING GOOD NEWS

Holy Trinity is blessed to have its Endowment Fund that continues to annually support initiatives outside of the church walls. The Endowment Committee is tasked each year with distributing the grant money that our fund yields to causes that serve the community. This year, more than ever, the needs in the community are great. Thru the Endowment Fund, Holy Trinity has been able to gift \$12,200 this year to:

- \$5,000 gift towards one unit at Prairie Pointe in Shakopee to provide stable housing for families in need.
- \$700 gift toward themed shirts for VBS 2020. This year many churches were not able to have a VBS program and the shirts helped kids feel a part of a common VBS.
- \$2,500 gift to "The Well" in New Prague, servicing youth in the area through mentorship programs.
- **\$2,000** gift to "School Supplies Giveaway Night" helping local and surrounding communities.
- \$2,000 gift to Cristo Obrero for their school supply drive benefiting the children & youth of the Riverview Terrace and Brandondale Mobile Home Parks in Chaska.

While it is an awesome achievement to be able to give away \$12,200 this year, we are reminded there are even greater needs in the community and many will have needs in the years to come.
