For twenty-one kids and their families, First Communion was supposed to happen in the spring. And then COVID hit. It was rescheduled for a lakeside service this summer, but Cedar Lake canceled all group activities. Holy Trinity polled the families and decided on a Drive-in First Communion in the parking lot on Sunday, October 11.

"These families were determined to have First Communion," Pastor Ben tells me. "In a collective Zoom meeting, we asked them, 'If it rains, do we still do it?' They all said, 'You bet!' I was prepared to be standing outside under an umbrella by myself, with Rita playing music from inside if we needed to!"

Sunday, October 11 was the second outdoor Drive-in Communion service for Holy Trinity, this time combined with First Communion. There was considerably less sneezing for Pastor Ben, (Click HERE to see that video), and more bread and juice involved.

"I'm excited!" Kate Kienow told me before the service. "I was skeptical about the meaningfulness of the first one, but some friends really recommended them! It made me feel so excited about this." Her son Aydan was one of the communicants.

"Thanks so much for the report on your missional discernment process 2019/2020. It is obvious that much work & effort and prayer went into this production and it was pulled off masterfully and beneficially.

It was a delight to help in initiating the 4 phase gatherings. It was an interesting journey for me & Eunice to think back through our time with HT and then to be reminded/recalling history before our arrival on the New Prague scene in 1970. I remember Ralph Hendricks saying (during a call process gathering), "I have lived in New Prague for 25 years and I am still not seen as a native"!!! This told me (us) something about the caste culture of this city (as was likely true of a host of cities) that piqued our awareness of past history and how we should/might approach our time of ministry in NP. The movement of the initial HT building, based upon a sense of growing participation, to an Elementary Worship/Education experience (even the administration office located in the basement of a town bank), to a choice of a new location for a city location allowing expansion (after initial construction, with the help of the ELCA), was Holy Spirit led & inspired. This was all led by some very forward looking lay people who were risk takers. Thanks Be To God for these brave, courageous souls.

It is my hope and prayer that our participation in that first "Looking Backward" session that the forces of change helped to inspire a vision of growing in unity and oneness with the community that allows HTLC to create a "new normal" for the congregation but also for the community at large because yearly there is an influx of "new people" who will help guide NP into a new culture (hopefully not solidify the old caste system)."
